#### Introduction session

- Cultural journalism today: a general overview of its mission, main fields and constraints
- Portraying and telling culture in the media: can culture be popular?
- Catching the audience: language, tools, perspective
- Transmedia approach: new ways of writing (the transmedia storytelling), of producing (media convergence, multiplatform), of promoting and raise participation around cultural events (social media, communities, etc.)

#### Analysis of some best practices in this sector

Some examples of successful and innovative media coverage of cultural events or topics will be shown by the trainers and their main features will be analysed and discussed with the participants.

#### Organisation of the practical teamwork

The participants will build up an international editorial-room in charge of setting up the media coverage of a cultural topic or event.

### DAY 3 - DAY 4 | Wednesday - Thursday

#### Practical teamwork:

Under the trainers guidance, the participants will:

- define the topic/event to be covered, the editorial approach, the production formats, the media involved (video and audio reportages, texts, photos, social media, etc.) and the ways of dissemination of the material produced;
- plan the preliminary work with the partners or sources of information (ex. national and/or local institutions, festivals, publishers, associations, ...) for the organisation of interviews, shootings, etc.
- plan the production and the post-production activity.

The participants will be divided into groups. The groups will conceive and produce their news and reportages. At the end of each day, the participants will gather to discuss about their work with the trainers.

Screening and analysis of good practices, difficulties, evaluation of potentialities and weaknesses of the work done.
