In the framework of the global celebrations of the UNESCO World Radio Day, the Villa Méditerranée together with COPEAM mobilize and give the floor to some media players in times of emergency and disaster.

13 February, the World Radio Day on the theme «Radio in times of emergency and disaster»: an occasion to foster the international cooperation, to encourage major networks and community radios to promote access to information, freedom of expression and gender equality on air.

The special evening organised at the Villa Méditerranée will start at 6 pm with the screening of the documentary Good Night Sarajevo by Olivier Algora and Edu Marin (2014) which will be followed by a roundtable about the conflict in Bosnia and Herzégovine and the role of the radio and the media in disaster and conflict areas and in the rebuilding process.
