Gabriela Ramos



Gabriela Ramos is the Assistant Director-General for the Social and Human Sciences of UNESCO. Her agenda embraces the achievement of social inclusion and gender equality, advancing youth development; promotion of values through sports; anti-racism and anti-discrimination, ethics of artificial intelligence.

Prior to this position, Ms. Ramos served as Chief of Staff and Sherpa to the G20/G7/APEC in the OECD, contributing to the global agenda. In 2019, she launched the *Business for Inclusive Growth* (B4IG) platform, bringing together 40 major multinational companies committed to

reducing inequalities. Previously, she was Director of the OECD Office in Mexico and Latin America and a member of the Mexican Foreign Service. In 2013, she was decorated with the “Ordre du Mérite” by the President of France. Her work to promote gender equality earned her the 2017 and 2018 *Forbes Excellence Award* as well as being included as part of *Apolitical*’s 100 Most Influential People in Gender Policy in both 2018 and 2019.

She is a Fulbright and Ford McArthur fellow, and a graduate of the Ibero-American University of Mexico City. She is member of several boards, among which the board of the Paris Peace Forum and of the UNICEF Advisory Board.

José Manuel Pérez Tornero



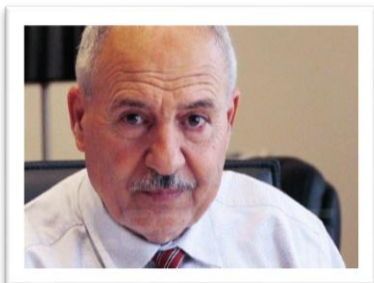
José Manuel Pérez Tornero is the President of the Spanish public broadcaster RTVE since March 2021. Journalist in the written press, radio and television, he has created and directed different television programmes, in particular in the cultural and educational fields. He holds a PhD in Communication Sciences and a degree in Hispanic Philology.

He is Professor of Journalism at the Autonomous University of Barcelona (AUB), where he also directs the RTVE-UAB chair and is member of the Observatory for News Innovation in the Information

Society. He is a UNESCO professor in Media and Information Literacy and Quality Journalism, with special emphasis on Europe, the Arab countries and Latin America. Currently, he is a member of the EBU Executive Board, of the Board of Directors of the ATEI (Association of Ibero-American Educational and Cultural Televisions) and of the UNESCO and European Commission's Expert Group on Media Literacy.

Nouri Lajmi



Nouri Lajmi is the President of the High Independent Communication Authority (HAICA) of Tunisia since 2013. He is also President of REFRAM - Réseau Francophone des Régulateurs des Médias, which brings together thirty media regulatory authorities from Europe, Africa and North America.

Doctor in information sciences, he has taught journalism at the Press and Information Sciences Institute at Manouba University in Tunis before leaving to Canada. He has lived in the province of Quebec for more than ten years, where he has collaborated with the Canadian International

Development Agency (CIDA), the Center for Research in Public Law of the University of Montreal (CRDP) and with the Department of information and communication of Laval University. He is the author of several scientific texts and studies on journalism, media regulation and journalistic ethics.

Jelena Jorgačević Kisić



Jelena Jorgačević Kisić has been working as a journalist for the Serbian news magazine "Vreme" since 2009 and writes mainly about social and religious issues. She holds M.A. of Theory of Culture, University of Belgrade and M.A. in Religious Studies, University of Erfurt in Germany.

Currently, she is completing her PhD studies at the University of Regensburg.

She has received several journalist awards and has organized many conferences about different aspects of the relationship between religion and media. In addition, she has conducted numerous projects that deal

with religion and society. She is regional representative for Europe of the International Association of Religion Journalists (IARJ), a global network of journalists promoting excellence in the coverage of religion and spirituality.

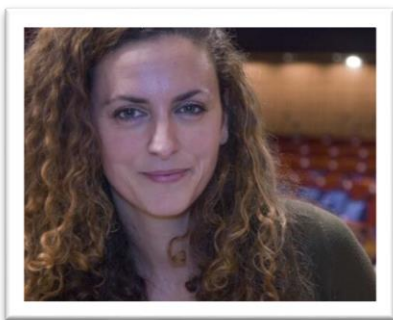
Federico Ruozzi



Federico Ruozzi is a researcher in History of Christianity at the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia (Italy), where he teaches Visual History and History of Interreligious Relations. He is fellow at the FSCIRE – Fondazione per le scienze religiose (Bologna), where he has been working since 2007 and he is secretary of the international review “Cristianesimo nella storia” since 2008. He was Visiting Fellow at the Cushwa Center for the Study of American Catholicism, Notre Dame University (IN). His field of research is Modern History and Church History. He has studied the relationship between religion and media, in particular between the Catholic Church and television. He collaborates with the multimedia lab

of FSCIRE in planning and producing video-exhibitions and documentaries, with RAI in the domain of historic audiovisual archives and with the Istituto della Enciclopedia Italiana, as author and editor of iconographical researches.

Marina Lalovic is a Serbian journalist based in Rome. She has been living in Italy since 2000, where she graduated from the University "La Sapienza" in Journalism and Publishing. She was one of the reporters of BABEL TV, the first Italian TV station completely dedicated to the topic of immigration in Italy.

She currently works as a journalist at the foreign desk of Rainews24 and collaborates with Radio Rai 3, Rai-Radiotelevisione Italiana.
